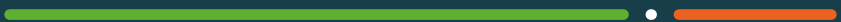

Strategies and Action Plans**



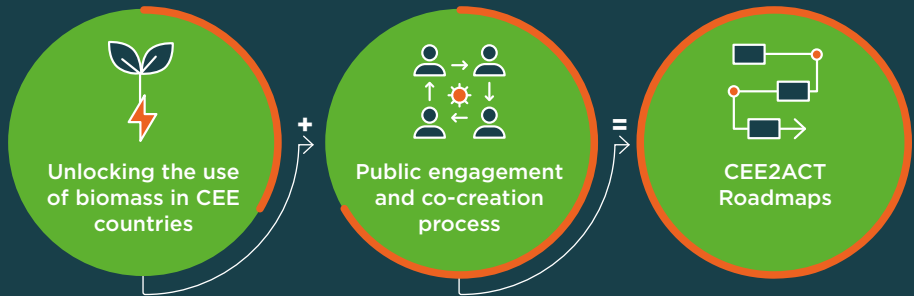
CEE2ACT is empowering countries in Central Eastern Europe and beyond to develop circular bioeconomy strategies and action plans through **innovative governance models**.
